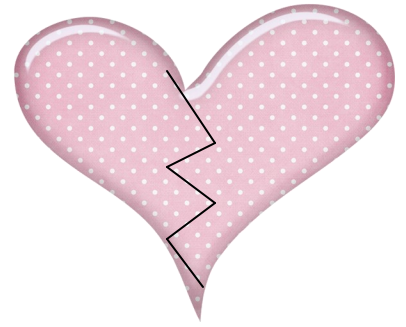


# broken heart

Level 1: Adding numbers to 10

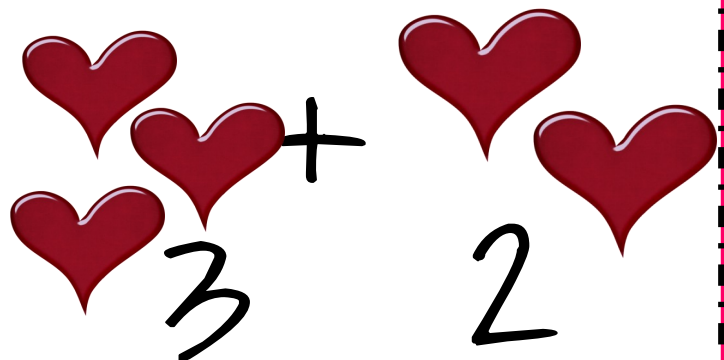
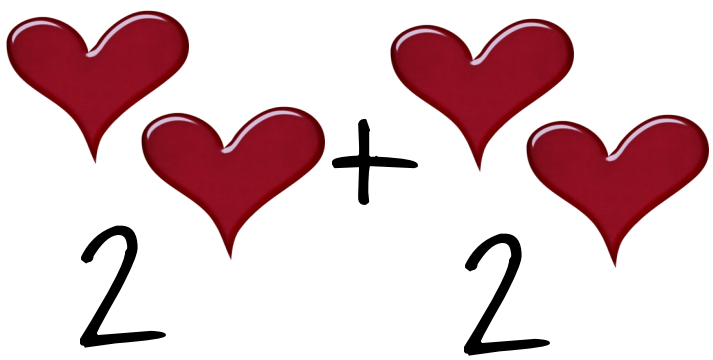
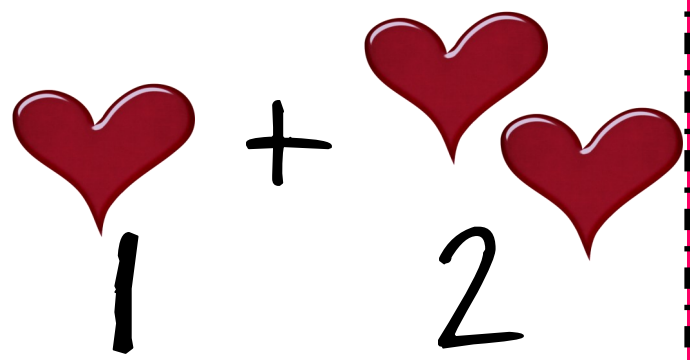
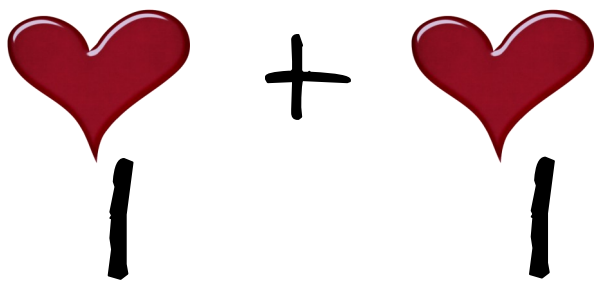
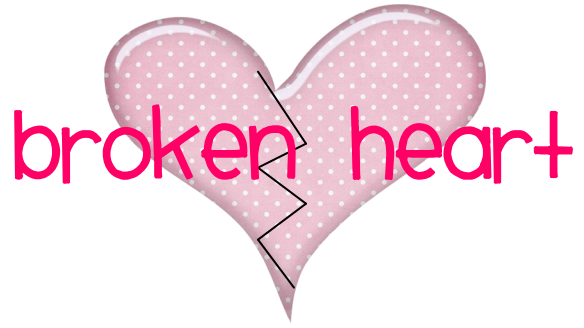
Level 2: Using place value to recognize numbers through 30

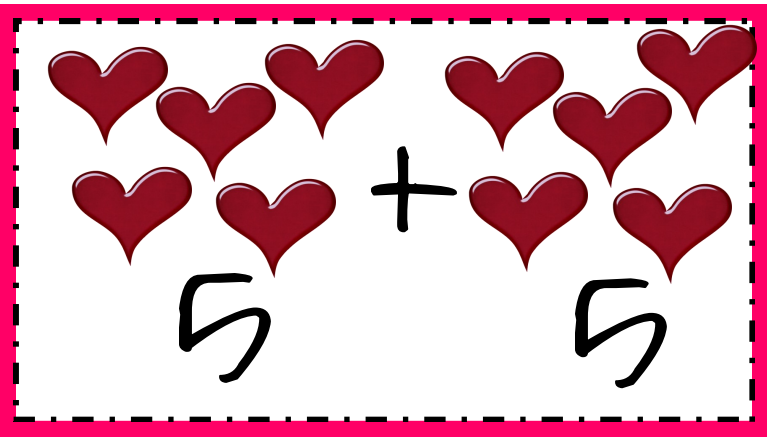
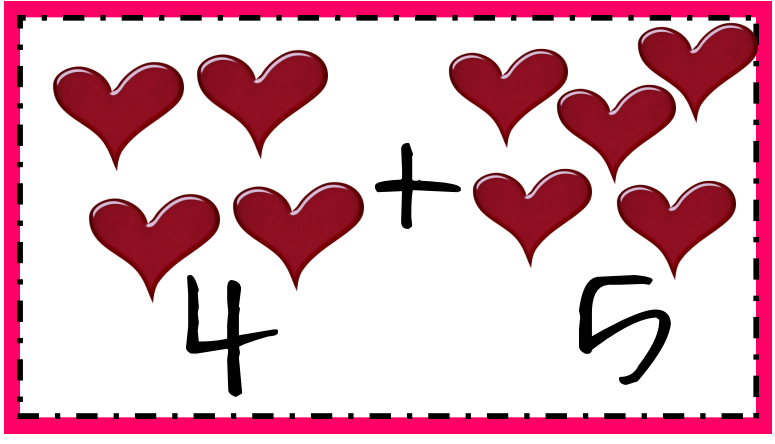
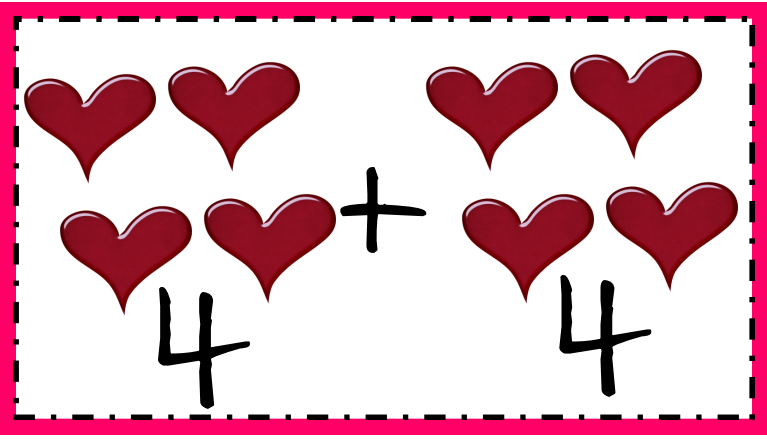
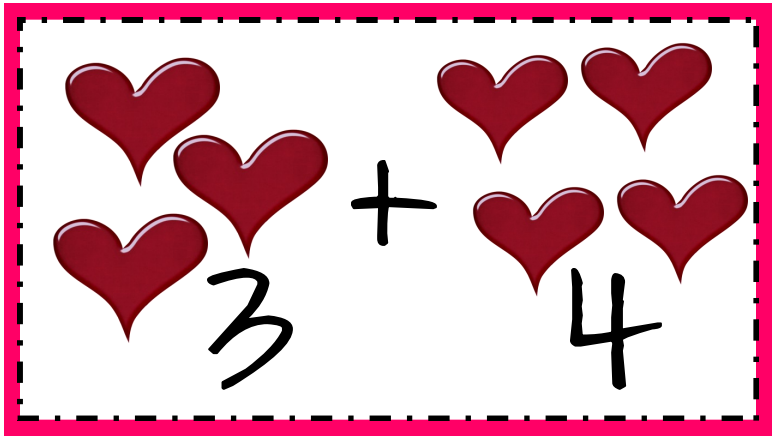
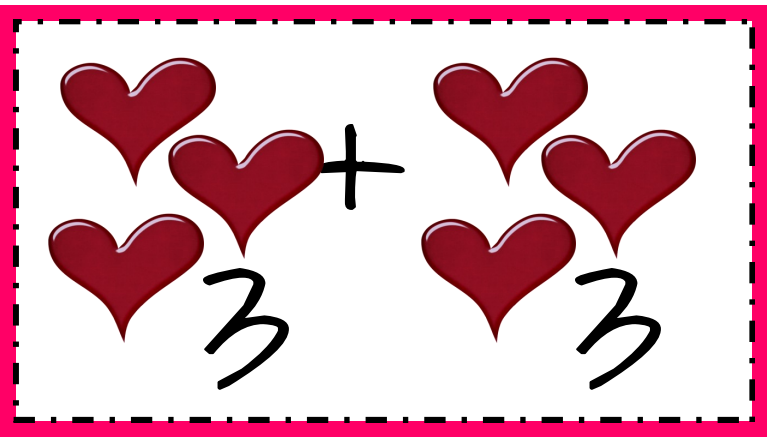

The person who covers the last number wins!











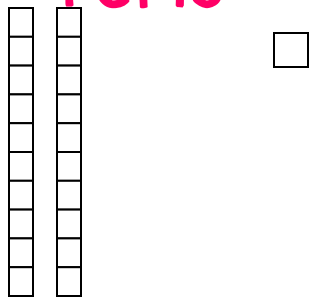
